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CALENDER FOR 2020 ELEARNING PROGRAMS: MAY -JUNE – JULY

The Covid19 crisis that has affected the entire world has also had an impact in provision of library services in South Africa, Johannesburg. Joburg Librarians have had to revisit the way library services are provided, by focusing on improving the use of ICT's and access to online content. Libraries will play a bigger role in assisting communities to use internet, and ICT tools as part of social distancing and self-paced learning where people might work from home and students from disadvantaged communities will still need access to ICT tools and Wi-Fi in safe spaces if they cannot go to schools or university campus for group lessons.

Currently – South Africa is in Level # Lockdown. Libraries are still preparing the sites through cleaning and procuring necessary equipment to ensure safety of both the public and the library staff. Reopening date has not been decided until all of the above measures are in place. In the meantime, Social media – Facebook- is the main platform used to communicate with the public and provide information services. The City website where the library page is located is being upgraded to accommodate the new way of working in libraries. The calendar below represents some of the activities that Joburg librarians are providing online.

PLEASE NOTE:

- 1. This calendar is from the eLearning office working collaboratively with eLearning champions (librarians), focusing on activities that require the use of technology or requiring access to internet to search for information etc– except for storytelling using a physical book.
- 2. This calendar and regular eLearning posts on Facebook, is just a contribution from the eLearning perspective, IT IS NOT replacing the normal post/posting on Facebook by reps. Staff are still allowed to post /submit posts on anything else that is not about technology /eLearning
- **3.** Any staff member, from general worker to senior management can suggest a topic and content will not always be videos, it can be posters, or a simple written post.
- 4. We will not be posting daily. We will try to keep the posts at minimum 2 max 4 per week so that it doesn't get cluttered.
