Dear Mr. Samarakis:

I have been working on a play since early summer. It is now finished, thank God, and I have not been able to attend to my correspondence. I see a letter from you dated May 31, referring to "The Flaw," which you sent to me from Athens. I did receive it and found it a powerful work. I only wish some of our people here who profess democracy would read it and see what it is they actually support.

I am anxious to know how things are with you. From time to time I have written and spoken about Greece, without much effect, I'm afraid. And now, according to the press, our Vice President has returned home after a completely reassuring visit to your country. I can only tell you that we are all living in a time when words and their substance are very confused--to the point of unrecognizability. And it is not only in the question of Greece.

This is only to greet you and to wish you well.
