Article 1. Structure

RSCVD (Resource Sharing during COVID-19) is an initiative of the IFLA Document Delivery & Resource Sharing Section.

RSCVD relies on a network of volunteers to supply, refer, and manage requests from around the world. Without a strong volunteer network, RSCVD ceases to be a viable service. Due to the nature of RSCVD's structure, it is intended as a service of last resort when documents cannot be obtained through regular, commonly-used resource sharing networks.

Article 2. Vision and Mission

Vision: The RSCVD initiative shares IFLA's vision of a strong and united library field powering literate, informed and participative societies.

Controlled Digital Lending

“Controlled Digital Lending (CDL) encompasses practices and technologies that allow libraries to loan print books to digital patrons in a ‘lend like print’ fashion.”

Principles of Controlled Digital Lending

- A library must own a legal copy of the physical book;
- A library must maintain an “owned to loaned” ratio, simultaneously lending no more copies than it legally owns; and,
- A library must use technical measures to ensure the digital file cannot be copied or redistributed.
