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Founder of the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, Patron of Christian Teachers



John Baptist de La Salle was born on April 30, 1651, in Reims, France. The son of aristocratic parents, La Salle had the opportunity for an excellent education and went on to be ordained a priest.

By 1684, having given up his personal wealth and title in society, De La Salle brought a group of schoolmasters together as the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools. The Institute was soon after recognized as an official Congregation of Religious in the Roman Catholic Church. The Congregation's primary purpose was to serve the educational needs of society, particularly among the poor.

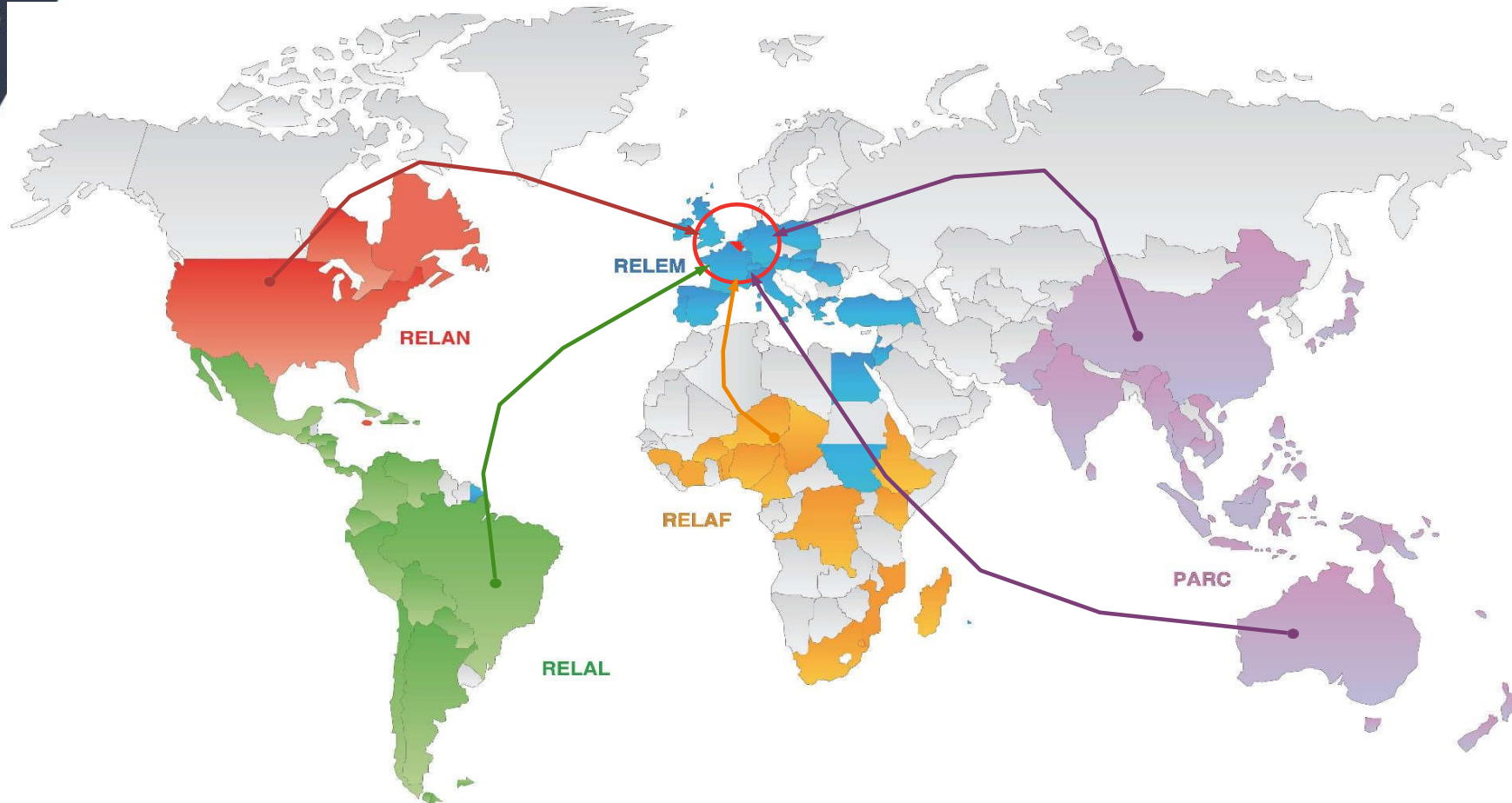
De La Salle contributed significantly to the entire field of education through his writings and innovative methodology. In 1900, John Baptist de La Salle was declared a saint of the Roman Catholic Church. Fifty years later, Pope Pius XII declared John Baptist de La Salle the Patron Saint of Teachers.

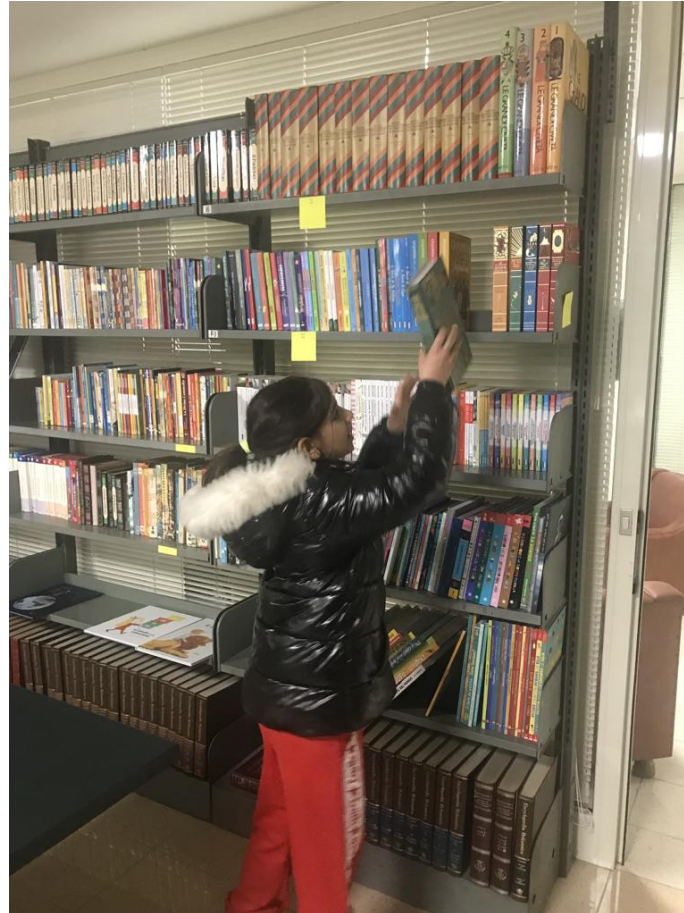

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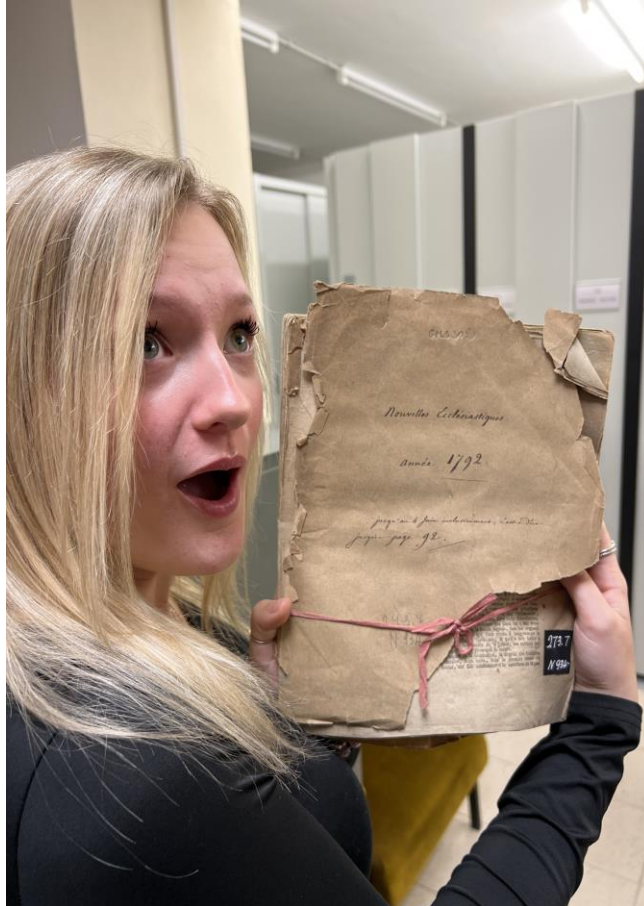

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Jansenist book collection from the 18th century: two different approaches

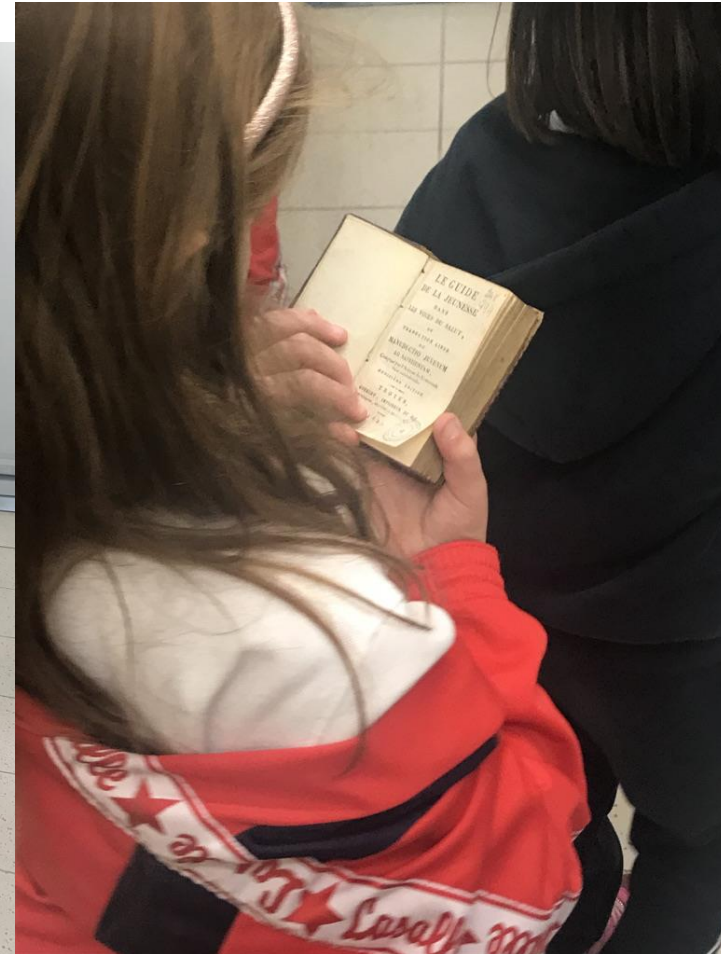

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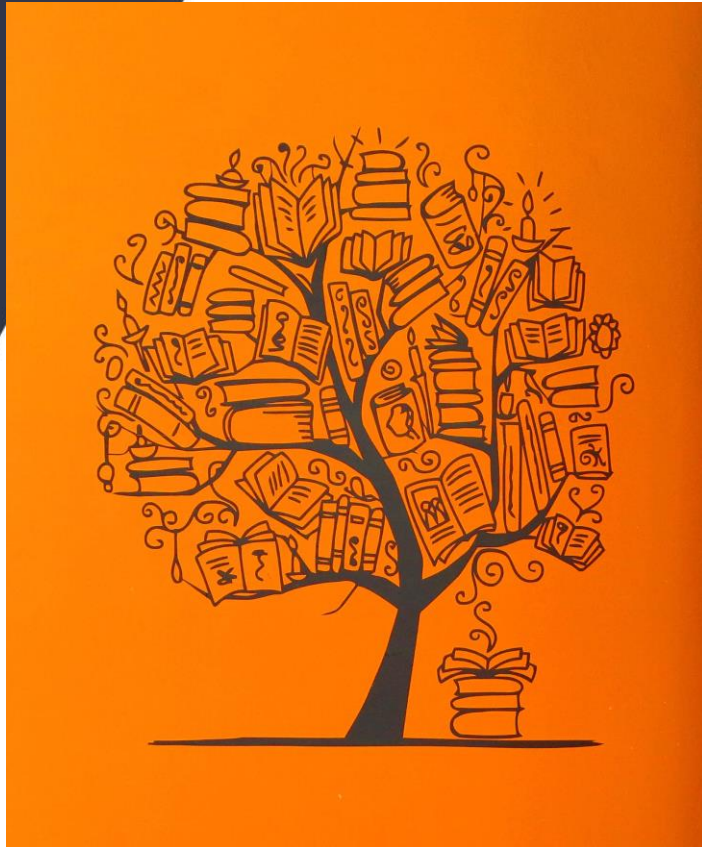
Jansenist book collection from the 18th century: two different approaches

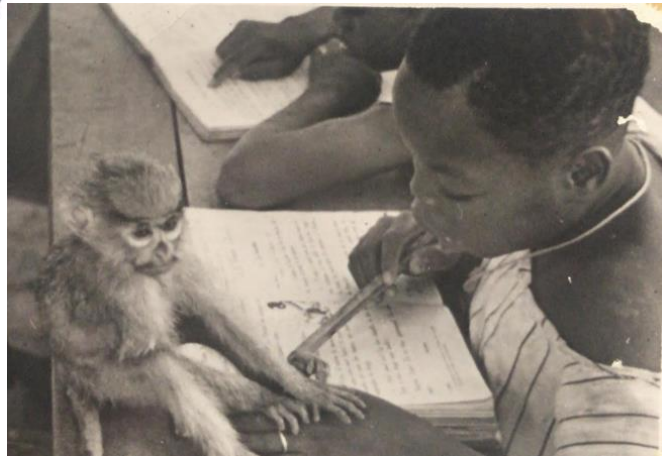
