Scope & Purpose

- The traditional work of acquisitions and collection development was to build an individual, owned collection, but this has changed:
 - With the move to more open content, what do we acquire and how?
 - How do we define the collection in shared environments?
 - How do libraries meet the collections needs of their users?

Impact of open access and open science on acquisition and collection development

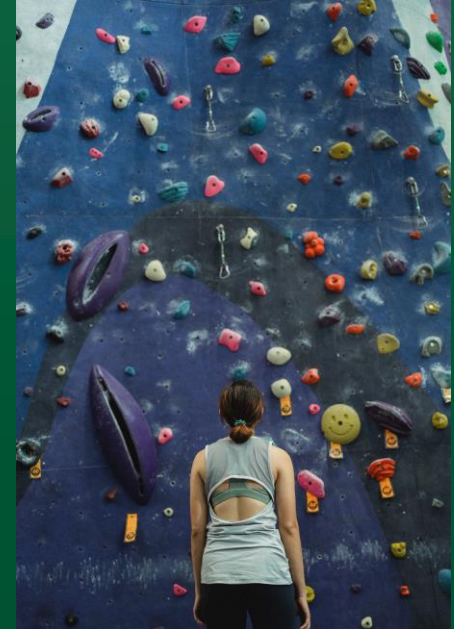
- ❑ What does acquisition and collection management “mean” with OA resources?
