

## **Overview 1**

#### 20 lessons per year

- Lessons which are compulsory for newly appointed researchers
  - Basic knowledge of interpretation of law
  - Search methods of legal materials of selected countries

Easily comprehensible materials concerning regulations of electronic cigarettes in the United States and the EU

Provided are the materials in the following material list as requested.

#### 1. The United States

Electronic cigarettes sold for the purpose of treatment of quitting smoking are regulated as drugs and medical devices under the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) initially aimed at regulating electronic cigarettes other than mentioned above as drugs and medical devices, but in the wake of the ruling by the Federal Court of Appeal in January 2011 that electronic cigarettes should be regulated as tobacco products, it changed its former policy in April of the same year to announce that electronic cigarettes would be regulated as tobacco products. In April 2014, the FDA announced a proposal for regulations on electronic cigarettes. The proposed regulations include a ban on sales to people under 18 and the prohibition of distribution of free samples.
